(over 60% of local residents returned their forms). This means all responsible households will pay just a small annual fee. A big Thank You to all who returned the questionnaires and to Waverley Tenants Organisation for a great result!

Judith Cleghorn reported on a very positive meeting with Janice Cambridge from SBHA and some of the SBHA Directors. They assured the LRA that they would be supportive of what they were trying to achieve in improving Langlee.

An application has been submitted to 'People's Millions' for £50,000 towards funding the Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA) at the Primary School. The LRA should be notified of the result towards the end of August.
