Waverley Tenants Organisation (WTO)

The WTO recently met with Mark Rodgers the newly appointed Services Manager with Waverley Housing. A number of topics were discussed including the recent fire in one of the blocks in Beech Avenue, Mark has assured us that the smoke damage to the stairwell will be cleaned and painted. The stairwell fire highlights the urgent need for the door entry systems to be repaired or in my view replaced. If your entry system does not work then report this to Waverley Housing. The WTO also discussed the rent increase of 5.5%, in the current climate this was seen as an excessive rent increase, but it was explained that it is in line with other landlords and is necessary to pay for the planned maintenance program for 2011. The Planned maintenance for 2011 has a budget of £881,119 which is targeted to bring approximately 300 Waverley Houses across the Borders up to the Scottish Housing quality Standard. The WTO welcome the investment but the Scottish government require that all 1500 Waverley houses meet this standard by 2015, to date a recent surveys indicates that none of the

Waverley Houses meet this standard. Waverley Housing have sent out a there annual Tenant satisfaction survey. The WTO helped shape this survey and it is your chance to give your views. If you haven't already completed the survey please do so, you still have time.

More Houses For Langlee?

An information day was held at the Langlee Community Centre on Saturday 26th February, when Persimmon Homes showed plans of the proposed new housing estate to be built on the far side of the Langshaws Road.

Persimmon hope that building of the first phase of 140 homes will be started in October of this year, with further phases later on.

The plans appeared to be comprehensive and ambitious – it was a shame that more residents did not go to see what is to happen – however, I will have a copy of the plans available for you to see at the Langlee Residents Association meeting next Tuesday 8th March, at the Community Centre.

Do come along and see what this will mean to our area.

Twice Baked Potatoes

Ingredients

- 4 medium potatoes
- 25g (1oz) Sun Flower spread
- 225g (8oz) 4oz edam 4oz mature cheddar grated
- 1 Onion, peeled and chopped
- 1 Green pepper, seeded and diced
- 1 Tablespoon wholegrain mustard
- 4 Un-smoked bacon rashers, chopped
- 2 Tablespoons low fat natural yoghurt
- 175g (6oz) Mushrooms, chopped
- Black pepper

Method

1. Pre heat oven to 200C/425F/Gas 7
2. Wash potatoes, then prick with a fork, bake for 1 hour – 1 hour 20 minutes.
3. For the filling, melt the low fat spread in a frying pan. Add the onion, green pepper and bacon. Fry for 3-4 minutes. Add the mushrooms and cook for a further 3 minutes, or until just tender.
4. Cut the tops off the potatoes. Scoop the flesh into a bowl and mush with a fork. Stir in the mushroom mixture, half the cheese, the mustard, yoghurt and black pepper. Mix well.
5. Spoon the filling mixture back into potato skins. Carefully transfer to baking tray. Sprinkle the remaining cheese on top.
6. Bake for 20 minutes, or until the filling is heated through and cheese is golden. Serve immediately.
