Along with representatives of Langlee Residents Association, Coopersknowe & Easter Langlee Residents Association and Gala & Langlee Community Council, I attended a meeting with Persimmon Homes to look at their proposals for their Easter Langlee site.

The site is due to have a variety of house styles and sizes, though they do aim to build for the family market here. They answered all the questions posed to them – as openly as developers will – but were very interested in some of the observations made. The site is to be developed in two phases and a planning application for the first phase is due imminently. Many questions were asked about the works themselves, and the access/safety of the road, as we all know how busy it is. My priority is for the work to be carried out on the road before the site works start to try and minimise the impact on us all.

There is to be a proportion of social housing included on the site, which is a requirement by Scottish Borders Council.

A development of this size will undoubtedly have an impact on our community, however, there is a benefit in that the new families which housing on this scale will bring will ensure the viability of
