**DOG FOULING**

Scottish Borders Council are continuing to prioritise their dog fouling campaign and wants to encourage all dog owners to take a responsible attitude to clearing up dog mess themselves.

SB Wardens, Lee Hutchison and Keith Johnson, cover the Eildon area, including Langlee, and report on this issue monthly. In the Galashiels area between January and May this year the following figures were recorded: 7 Fixed Penalty Notices of £40 were issued; 187 clean ups took place; 23 people were advised about picking up dog dirt and 39 information leaflets were distributed.

Judith Cleghorn, Chair of the LRA, stated “I want this message to be loud and clear, as dog dirt is a huge problem in the Langlee area. I am delighted to see SBC taking such a firm stance over the issuing of fines.”

Wardens are trained to issue Fixed Penalty notices and will take this action when necessary. 22 other volunteers from Parks and Open Spaces and SB Local have also been trained to issue notices. **News Release from Scottish Borders Council: Tuesday 25 May 2010**

A ball wall, an easily accessible bucket swing, and a dragonfly see-saw have been installed in Langlee.

SBC has listened to suggestions from Langlee Residents Association, and local councillors agreed that money raised through the pay and display scheme should be used for more play equipment

The swing and see-saw have been introduced to the play park in Woodstock Avenue and the ball wall is located in Beech Avenue. All three pieces of equipment are based on safe surfaces, and all the equipment in Woodstock Avenue has had a fresh coat of paint.

Judith Cleghorn, Chair of the LRA, said: “it’s brilliant to have an accessible swing in Langlee. It’s a local facility which we’re very proud of and pleased to have. We are very grateful to SBC for listening to our request.”

Dougie Mallin, Parks Development Officer at SBC, said: “along with other developments to improve the area in Langlee it was felt important to upgrade the play park in Woodstock Avenue and improve facilities for local children. The park is now fresh and bright and can appeal to children with varying physical capabilities.”

**PARENTS MIXER GROUP - E.S.O.L. AT LANGLEE**

My name is Ela Nosal. I have lived in Galashiels for two and a half years. When I first came here I was very lost. I did not speak English and I was very isolated.

I have been attending the ESOL group at Langlee Primary since it started nearly two years ago. I have met many new friends from this country who have helped me to enrol my children in school and to learn English.

Langlee School (and the wider community) is very welcoming to parents and children of every nationality. When Ann Reid (former Family Support Worker at Langlee Primary School) learned I could not attend college due to family commitments she organised the ESOL group. Now many parents attend the group and our children play happily in the crèche. The group is run by volunteers. The group is on every Wednesday afternoon (during term time) from 1pm until 3pm in the library at Langlee Primary School.

**LANGLEE PLAY AREAS**

The last couple of months have seen a fair amount of work going on, with the Ball Wall now installed in Beech Avenue and new equipment and a spruce up for the play park in Woodstock Avenue.

For those who haven’t seen it yet, the Ball Wall is a bit of a misnomer, it’s not a wall, it’s more of a tall fence, with a goal mouth and a basketball hoop. It has been very popular since it was installed and there is a bit more work to do to make the area safer for children playing (and for drivers) and to introduce equipment for different ages.

The new equipment is a multi-ability swing which lets children with physical disabilities join in the fun, and a dragon see-saw which you lie on. My daughter enjoys the swing, but she also has great fun on the slide - especially the tall one! Existing equipment got a new coat of paint and looks great.

One problem, however, is continuing litter in there. It doesn’t all come from children; when we were there a couple of weeks ago there were loads of bottles, thankfully not broken, but if you see people using this area for drinking, etc, please let the Community Wardens know so that it can be kept clean and safe for our children.
